Feast Together



High Tea Cup and Saucer Workshops with Tatyanna Meharry

During this class you will create 2 sets of cups and saucers using porcelain clay.

One set will be yours to keep and the other will go into a mixed pool of tableware for The High Tea Event at The Great Hall for the Festival. This set will then go home with the user.

The porcelain will be provided for the workshop and I will glaze the set that comes away with me. You will need to glaze your set when it is ready.

Throwing Sat 10-12 throwing, Sun 10-12 turning and finishing, dates to be confirmed, \$85

On Saturday I will demonstrate how to knead, weigh and throw a fine porcelain tea cup. I will show you how to use a rib tool to open and create the perfect rounded bowl shape with an ultrafine lip. We will also make a matching saucer. These items will then have to be left to harden to leather hard for trimming on Sunday. We will be exploring how porcelain clay can stretch and become super thin, which in the firing process will make the walls transparent.

On Sunday we will trim our cups and saucers, then attach handles using contemporary stylings. I will also demonstrate how to make a set of cake plates for a cake stand using textures, slab and press moulds as we go.

You will need your standard throwing equipment, a smooth metal rib tool, a plastic bag and around 500gms of clay for making a turning chuck from and a good sharp turning ribbon tool. I will bring some with me if you are unable to find one.

Hand building Sun 1-4pm, dates to be confirmed, \$85

On Saturday I will demonstrate how to texture clay and carve into a block of clay to create a Kurinuki style pair of cups. We also make saucers using the same textures that suit the rugged and natural nature of our cups. We will be exploring the wonderful ice like nature of porcelain when it is weighty and how the individuality of this style of making creates a special partnership with the makers and owners hand.

I will also demonstrate how to make a set of cake plates for a cake stand using textures, slab and press moulds as we go.

You will need to bring your standard hand building tools, a small craft knife, a small serrated knife, a bic biro pen that we can pull apart and a sharp loop tool for removing clay material from the inside of the vessel.

The throwing class will suit those who can confidently centre and pull up to create a cylinder or a bowl.

The handbuilding class is suitable for all levels.
