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FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

Administrative matters:

I am pleased to announce that our new committee members are investigating setting up our own CPA website which will enable members to advertise their pottery for sale if they so desire as well as showcasing some of our members work. Watch this space!

Unfortunately our financial audit is very late with year. This is due in part to our contact at Staples and Rodway leaving and not telling anyone. We now have a new contact and hopefully our accounts will be audited with dispatch especially as we have signed up with Xero accounting which has gone a long way to simplifying our accounts and making audits easier (a big thanks to our Treasurer, Toni for all her work in this area). Once this audit is forthcoming we will need to organise a special AGM to approve them.

Practical matters.

We have installed two new wheels and retired two that were becoming worn.

The slab roller will soon have new canvass.

We have new shelves for the gas kiln.

Steve Dench has been working on a new Raku kiln and we are currently discussing the best means of supplying the kiln with gas.

Due to the wax frying pan being left on in the past we have installed a cut-off switch for the power plug that actuates after 20 minutes and an RDC (Residual Current Device) has also been installed to prevent electrocution. PLEASE do not try and circumvent these safeguards by plugging the wax into another plug, these safeguards have been put in place for your protection.

Due to items going missing we have placed a lock on the outside storage shed door.

We have a new system for invoicing and receipting at the CPA, so please follow these instructions and let us know if you have any questions. Thank you!

If you are buying clay, or paying for firing, rent, or kiln firing, you need to complete an invoice. Payment type (cash, cheque, internet) needs to be indicated on the invoice. One copy of the invoice is retained by you – the remaining two copies are left in the invoice book.

Please don't fill out an invoice if the amount is less than \$10. You can put multiple items/payments on one invoice. You can keep track of your firings on your own firing sheet (in the book by the firing book), and complete an invoice when the total is \$10 or more.

CASH OR CHEQUE PAYMENTS

If you are paying for an invoice by cash or cheque, you need to write a receipt

The receipt should state your name, invoice number and amount. You retain one copy of the receipt, one copy goes in an envelope/cash bag with the cash or cheque, and placed in the safe.

INTERNET PAYMENTS

You do not need to write a receipt for internet payments. Use the invoice number as a reference when you pay.

FIRING RECORDS

If you are firing your work, please record your firings on your own firing sheet.

- Create one from the blank sheets in the pink lever arch file file it alphabetically by surname in the folder.
- Once your firings reach \$10 or more, please fill out an invoice, a receipt (if required) and pay.
