

EXPLODING POTS

This is what happens during a firing when your pot is not completely dry or has air bubbles!

Please make sure your pots are completely dry and free of air bubbles when they are put up for the bisque firing. If in doubt leave more time for your pieces to dry particularly when they are a bit thicker.

We are very privileged to have **Royce McGlashen** from Brightwater in Nelson to be our selector and our guest exhibitor for our exhibition. Royce is well known as one of New Zealand's leading potters. He qualified as a Master Potter in 1971. He is a member of the International Academy of Ceramics (Geneva) and in 1989 received an MBE for his services to pottery in New Zealand.

At his studio in Brightwater near Nelson he produces a wide range of tableware, ceramic art pieces and paintings. Hand decoration and interesting surface treatments have always been a feature of Royce's work. He has won many awards and his work is held in numerous public and private collections.


SLAB MAKING CONSTRUCTION OCTOBER 2022 TEXTURING & **DECORATING**

OBITUARY DENISE WELSFORD

Denise Welsford was a much loved Canterbury potter and teacher who died peacefully in Christchurch on 23 May 2022.

She was born in the small Canterbury town of Kirwee in 1931 and began potting in Governor's Bay in 1965. Her training included study with eminent potters Yvonne Rust and Michael Trumic. In 1968 she began teaching from her home in Totara Street, Christchurch. Favouring domestic stoneware, Denise became a full time potter in 1972. She exhibited regularly with the NZ Society of Potters and the NZ Academy of Fine Arts.

In 1975 she joined her partner Rex Valentine, Michael Trumic, Margaret Ryley and Frederika Ernsten in establishing Studio 393 in a large upstairs former bakery at 393 Montreal Street. Later they were joined by Lawrence Ewing and together they built up a lively, nationally significant hub for the discussion, exhibiting and sales of pottery.

Denise became the first president of the Canterbury Potters' Association when we acquired rooms in the Arts Centre in 1974.



The saggar workshop with Penny de Jong attracted beginners like me and lots of pros, including some who had done saggar firing before, but I think we all learnt a lot and had a blast. First we had a pre-workshop session learning the best way to apply terra sigillata and burnish our pots. Then on the weekend itself Penny explained more about the origins of the process (saggars were first used to protect porcelain pots from bits of ash etc flying around the kiln, but now we are using them to trap elements to burn up and colour the pieces inside the saggar package). We got stuck into jamming all manner of inorganic and organic material around our pots: pieces of

silver and copper wire, sprinkling salt, copper carbonate, coffee grinds, banana skins, seed pods and more. This was all contained first by tin foil, and then a paper mache using slip and fabric or newspaper, all finally encased in a thin sheet of clay. The firing didn't go as expected and some CPA fairies unloaded and reloaded the kilns, ensuring all was well when we returned on Sunday morning. We cracked open the saggars, which was much like cracking open a moa egg, finding our fossilised pots inside. We were all delighted and surprised by the results. Thanks Penny for sharing your knowledge with us in such a satisfying workshop.



The Suzy Dünser teapot throwing workshop took place over a sunny weekend in winter. Saturday morning started with Suzy giving us a demonstration on throwing the body of the pot. This included a technique for creating perfectly curved walls with a straight edged tool – it still twists my head thinking this one out!

Soon it was our turn to throw the teapot bodies using 1 kg on the wheel – quite a challenge for some of us. After bodies, Suzy showed us a couple of options for lids that won't fall out of the pot when you're pouring a cuppa.

Sunday started with pulling a few handles, with Suzy giving us pointers on making a handle fit the pot while staying true to the overall design. With the handles arranged on the benches to firm up we moved on to spouts.

The final stage of the course was assembly. Suzy taught us how to position spouts and handles for best effect, and how to hide the fact a pot isn't perfectly circular. After a communal deep breath we punched holes in our bodies, attached spouts over them, then added handles. Drop the lid in the top and the pot's complete!

The weekend was a great success and all who attended agreed they'd got a lot out of it. There were as many different styled teapots as there were throwers on the course. Suzy was an excellent tutor, generous with her time and knowledge and full of great tips for us. One of her key messages was that we didn't need to chase perfection with our pottery, and small mistakes add character. My pots are surely some of the most characterful you'll find...
